Mercy Hospital prepares to open second cardiac catheterization lab

We have successfully met our fundraising goal for the 2023 Leading With Heart campaign! Thank you to all our generous supporters who helped make this second cardiac catheterization lab possible. This enhancement for Mercy Hospital will help our caregivers save hundreds of lives each year.

Construction is now underway, thanks in part to Durango High Noon Rotary, which made an incredible gift of \$108,350 toward the project on February 1 – their largest capital gift to date.

Finally, we organized a ribbon-cutting ceremony on May 2 to celebrate this achievement with our Cardiology department, community partners and hospital leaders. Thank you to all of our supporters! Every gift has been pivotal in helping us reach this milestone, beginning an exciting new chapter of humankindness and healing.

2 NICU priority project completed thanks to community gifts

We are proud to share that the long-awaited enhancements to our Level II Neonatal Intermediate Care Unit (NICU) and Family Birth Center are now complete!

With \$342,259 donated by a community of 70 supporters, the project helped purchase essential, state-of-the-art equipment for the NICU. This purchase marks a significant advancement in our ability to care for infants born at 32 weeks or older, those as young as 30 weeks who meet specific criteria, and newborns up to 30 days old needing readmission.

Much of the project also focused on preparing a comfortable space for families with infants in our NICU, as well as creating a dedicated wellness space for our hardworking nurses.

Mercy Hospital's Family Birth Center – the only facility with a Level II NICU in the Four Corners area – supports the birth of more than 840 babies each year, 17% of whom require specialized treatment.
